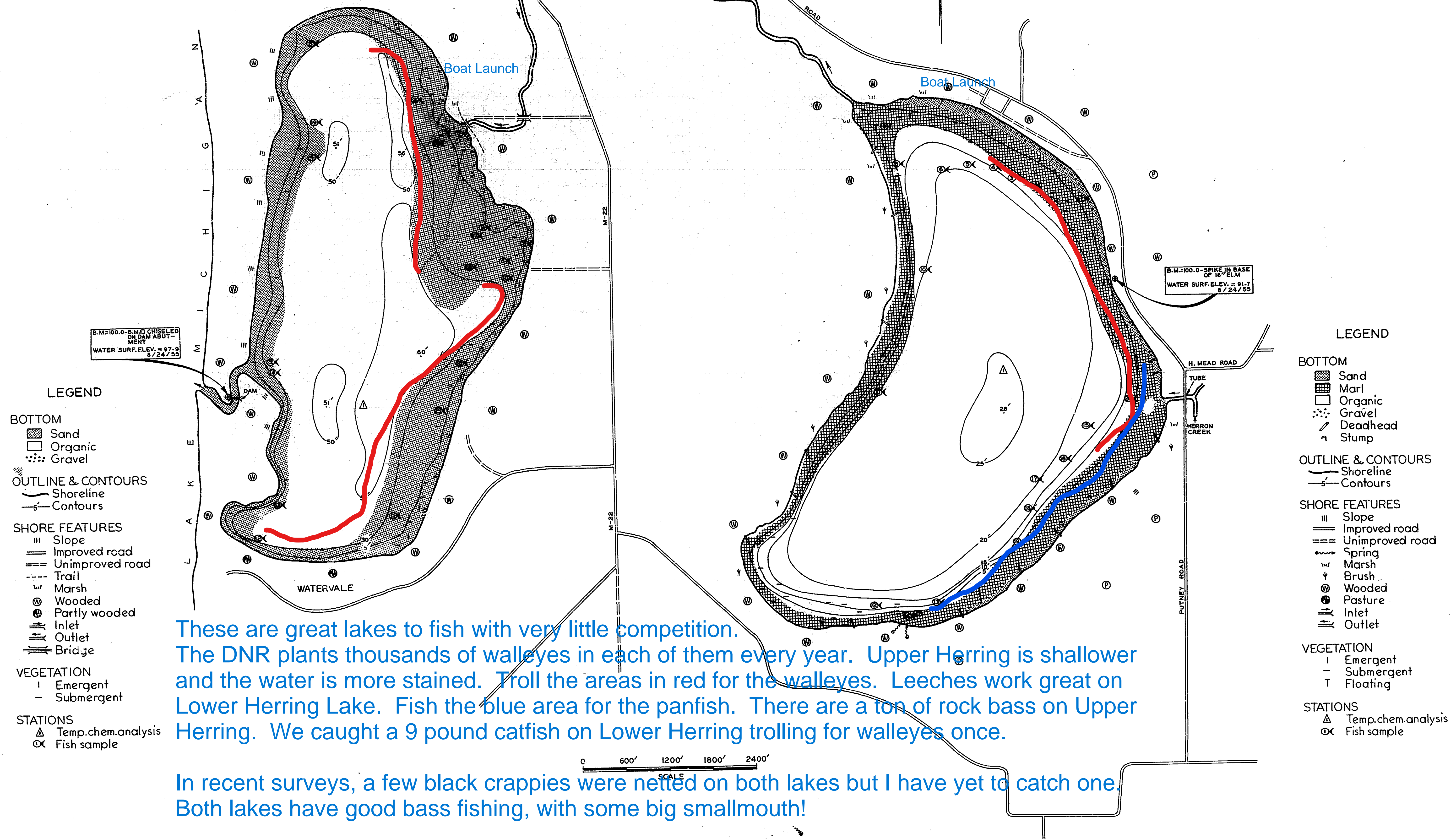

These are great lakes to fish with very little competition. The DNR plants thousands of walleyes in each of them every year. Upper Herring is shallower and the water is more stained. Troll the areas in red for the walleyes. Leeches work great on Lower Herring Lake. Fish the blue area for the panfish. There are a ton of rock bass on Upper Herring. We caught a 9 pound catfish on Lower Herring trolling for walleyes once.

In recent surveys, a few black crappies were netted on both lakes but I have yet to catch one. Both lakes have good bass fishing, with some big smallmouth!
